Peace Hub Activist - Volunteer Task Outline

Thank you for your interest in becoming a Peace Hub Activist – our work for peace and justice relies on the support of people like you.

Volunteer Role

Peace Hub uses a rolling programme of peace and justice themes – from resisting the arms trade to promoting Fairtrade - to inform and engage the public, and inspire people to take action. Peace Hub Activists help Peace Hub engage members of the public who drop into our shop-space at 41 Bull Street, Birmingham, B4 6AF.

As a Peace Hub Activist, you are asked to volunteer from 11:00 until 14:30, with 30 minutes break, on days agreed mutually between you and the Peace Hub Coordinator.

Task Outline

As a Peace Hub Activist, you will be asked to carry out the following tasks:

- Communicate face-to-face with members of the public about peace and justice, particularly the current peace and justice theme, and put across a passion for peace and justice.
- Encourage and support members of the public to take action for peace and justice.
- Communicate a little about Quakers and why Quakers take action for peace and justice.
- Answer questions from the public where you feel confident to, and pass on other queries to the Peace Hub Coordinator. You are not expected to know everything!
- Help with your fair share of practical tasks, such as washing up and tidying.

Support you can expect

As a volunteer, you will receive an induction, and consistent support, encouragement, guidance, and relevant training.

There will always be at least one other person (staff or volunteer) alongside you at the Hub.

You will have the chance to review your role regularly and offer suggestions for changes/improvements to the way Peace Hub works.

Reasonable out-of-pocket expenses will be reimbursed.
